Tales Between the Tides (ages 3-5)


Crab Shells (entering grades 3-4)

The program includes an auditorium program about the unique fish, the aquarium is open for exploration, then a guided observation at the beach. Cabrillo Beach closes at midnight. Warm clothing and a flashlight are recommended. During April, May and June (closed season) grunion may be observed but not touched. March, and July are open season, when grunion may only be taken by hand. Grunion hunters, 16 years or older, must have a valid California fishing license.
